


Preparedness

"Increases the ability to respond quickly and effectively to emergencies and to recover more quickly from their long-term effects and involves actions taken prior to an event to ensure the capability and capacity to respond."



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Emergency Planning Act

- Local emergency plans 9(1) Every local authority shall:
 - (a) establish a local emergency measures organization;
 - (b) appoint a person as a local emergency measures co-ordinator; and
 - (c) establish a local emergency planning committee composed of:
 - (i) the emergency measures co-ordinator appointed pursuant to clause (b); and
 - (ii) any other persons the local authority considers necessary.
 - (2) The emergency measures co-ordinator is the chairperson of the local emergency
 - $\ensuremath{(3)}$ Every local emergency planning committee shall establish a municipal emergency plan governing:
 - (a) the provision of necessary services during an emergency; and
 - (b) the procedures under and the manner in which persons will respond to an emergency.

10 Every local authority shall at all times be responsible for the direction and control of the local authority's emergency response unless the minister assumes direction and control pursuant to clause 18(1)(c).

EMO Coordinator

It is recommended they are **not** a member of the local authority, an elected official, or a first responder (i.e., Fire Chief).

- Liaise with local industries, businesses and organizations regarding their emergency management plans and preparedness.
- Provide a strategy and means for public education of emergency preparedness.
- Ensure that a continuous program of training is made available for local Emergency Management personnel.
- Submit a projected budget to cover costs of emergency management operations of the Committee.



EMO Coordinator (continued)

- Work with the Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) Team and Local Authority when an emergency has been declared and the activation of an EOC is required. More specifically, these duties include, but are not limited to:
 - · Activate call out of the EOC team members.
 - Assist with the set-up of the EOC location.
 - · Assist EOC Director as required.
 - Provide technical assistance with the Emergency Plan, its procedures and resources.
 - Coordinate post-emergency debriefings and preparation of reports.
 - Ensure amendments to the emergency plan are made.
 - · Retain documentation of actions and decisions.
